

House Bill 71 has been introduced - with bi-partisan support: The Okefenokee Protection Act

The Okefenokee is one of the greatest remaining natural treasures in the world and holds significant

economic, ecological, and cultural value for the people of Georgia. We cannot risk long-term damage to the swamp for an experimental, unsustainable mining project. Now is the time for state action to protect this national treasure. Opponents of mining near the Okefenokee want to prevent permanent damage of the swamp's ability to hold water. Twin Pines officials argue mining will have minimal impacts.

C. Rhett Jackson, professor of water resources at the University of Georgia, described the mining plan as "deeply flawed." He said mining will

make droughts more frequent and severe in the eastern portion of the swamp and increase the probability of

wildfires.

Heads Up For Habitat

Activities have resumed for many Habitat for Humanity affiliates in Georgia. The Garden Club of Georgia, Inc. garden clubs are encouraged to contact their nearest H4H affiliate to discuss a partnership whereby clubs can provide expertise to local projects. We know that landscaping is the finishing touch on homebuilds. Landscape projects need not be elaborate. In fact, the simpler the better. Only low maintenance plants should be selected: specifically those plants that require little pruning, are disease resistant, and tolerate dry periods. Information about the needs of the new landscaping can be prepared for the new homeowners.

Garden clubs might choose to only design the landscaping, provide tools for the new homeowners, or present horticulture classes for new homeowners. Remember this might be the first property they have owned, so these are new skills to learn.


